	ring to help keep your baby safe during sleep:
<ul> <li>Infants will always be placed flat on their backs for routine sleep -</li> </ul>	naps and nighttime.
<ul> <li>Only one infant will be placed to sleep in each crib with no bed-sh will be placed in separate cribs.</li> </ul>	-
<ul> <li>Infants will be placed on a firm mattress, with a tight fitted sheet, requirements CFR 1219 for full-size cribs and CFR 1220 for non-ful adult beds, recliners or other soft surfaces.</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>No toys, soft objects, stuffed animals, pillows, bumper pads, bopp bedding will be in the sleep environment including nothing draped</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Devices such as wedges or infant positioners will not be used. The devices are safe and their use may increase the risk of suffocation</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>The use of home monitors or commercial devices marketed to red are not recommended by the AAP.</li> </ul>	luce the risk of SIDS/SUID will not be used and
<ul> <li>To avoid overheating, the temperature of the room where infants that is comfortable for a lightly clothed adult.</li> </ul>	sleep will be monitored and kept at a level
<ul> <li>Infants will be monitored for overheating. Signs of overheating inc</li> </ul>	clude sweating or feeling warm to the touch.
If extra warmth is needed, sleep clothing (instance of the content of	
footed pajamas, sleep sacks) will be used as an alternative to blan	
<ul> <li>Swaddling is not necessary or recommended in the child care settion</li> <li>overheating, hip dysplasia and SIDS.</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Infants may use a pacifier during sleep with parent permission. No including a string, cord, or stuffed toy. Pacifiers may not be attach</li> </ul>	•
<ul> <li>If the infant falls asleep anyplace other than a crib (i.e.: bouncy cheld) the infant will be immediately moved to a crib and placed flat</li> </ul>
